Academy Council Visit to Parliament

Early on Monday morning, 51 students from the Academy Council travelled down to the Houses of Parliament in London. The students were shown around the Palace of Westminster where both Lords and MPs work and debate the issues of the day. They were able to see The Throne Room (where the King gave his speech), the House of Lords chamber, the House of Commons chamber, and Westminster Hall where the Queen was lying in state before her funeral.

After the tour the students went into a Law and Debating Workshop. This explained how acts become law. The students then engaged in a real debate about "Should exams be banned in schools". Students were split into government and opposition party, they had to give reasons for their party's opinion. Finally, they had to provide a closing argument for their party and then vote for the law.



Year 10 into University/ Business Focus Workshop

A group of Year 10 students had the opportunity to work with volunteers from Openreach at the Peterborough depot this week. Students took part in a leadership activity which required them to split into two teams and compete against one another to plan and design a campaign for a particular city to host the global games event. They participated in a vast range of tasks that required them to obtain points to become successful. In a highly close contest team Madrid outscored Chicago by five points. An excellent day where students developed a wide range of skills and gained an insight to a wide range of careers.

Operating Theatre Live

On Tuesday we hosted a company called Operating Theatre Live for the day along with 60 of our Year 10 students. The company brought the UKs only live surgical operating theatre to our Academy.

The students had an awesome experience working with the clinical team, scrubbing up to chart the treatment of a patient through from incident to trauma surgery. They had hands-on dissection of real organs, real clinical intervention, and surgical procedures all matched to their GCSE Science Exam.
